3. What are the five sections into which the English Old Testament has been traditionally divided? As a bonus...what are the three sections into which the Jewish people traditionally divided these same books?
4. List the Five Foundational “Books of Moses” from the Old Testament & tell a little something about each one.
5. How many books are in the New Testament?
6. What are the five sections into which the New Testament is traditionally divided?
7. List the “Four Gospels” from the New Testament & tell a little something about each one. As a bonus...tell a little something about the Book of Acts which follows the Gospels.
8. What languages were the books of the Bible written in.
9. Over what period of time were the various books of the Bible written?
10. About how many human authors were involved?
11. What is the difference between an “autograph” & a “manuscript”? As a bonus...approximately how many do we have of each?
12. Explain briefly why we can be confident that our modern Bibles are the “Word of God.”
13. What is the basic difference between “Formal Equivalence” & “Dynamic Equivalence” translations of the Bible? As a bonus...which does Thomas recommend & why? As a further bonus...which type is your own Bible?
14. What sort of publications are the “Living Bible” & “The Message”? As a bonus...does Thomas recommend them & why or why not?
15. What are some of the key questions that should be used in good Bible study?
