- 11. What is the difference between an "autograph" & a "manuscript"? As a bonus…approximately how many do we have of each?
- 12. Explain briefly why we can be confident that our modern Bibles are the "Word of God."
- 13. What is the basic difference between "Formal Equivalence" & "Dynamic Equivalence" translations of the Bible? As a bonus...which does Thomas recommend & why? As a further bonus...which type is your own Bible?
